#### Divemaster

- **Minimum age:** 18
- **Usual Duration:** 10-14 days
- **Course prerequisites:**
  - Be certified as a PADI Advanced Open Water Diver (or equivalent).
  - Be certified as a PADI Rescue Diver (or equivalent).
  - Have logged a minimum of 20 open water dives prior to entry into PADI Divemaster training, and completed and logged a minimum of 60 open water dives with experience in night, deep and navigation prior to certification as a PADI Divemaster.
  - Be at least 18 years old.
  - Be in good physical condition for diving and submit a medical exam form signed by a physician.

## Assistant Instructor course

- **Minimum age:** 18
- **Usual Duration:** 4 days plus optional but highly recommended IDC Pre-Study and Preparation Workshop.
- **Course prerequisites:** Prior to the start an individual must complete all (16) IDC Knowledge Reviews.
  - Be certified as a PADI Divemaster or hold a leadership level certification with another recreational diver training organization.
  - Be fit for diving and submit a Medical Statement for a diving medical examination conducted within the past 12 months. A licensed physician must sign the form and state that the candidate is fit for diving. The physician signing the form may not be the applicant.
  - Have been a certified diver for at least six months and have completed and logged at least 60 open water scuba dives (as documented in the individual's log book) and have documentation of experience in deep, night and navigation diving.
  - Submit proof of CPR and first aid training within the last 24 months.
  - Submit documentation of any qualifying certification for entry-level, advanced, rescue and leadership-level issued by another recreational diver training organisation.
  - If not a PADI Divemaster, successfully complete the PADI Divemaster course diver rescue assessment.

The PADI Assistant Instructor (AI) course is a 4-day course designed to prepare PADI Divemasters or equivalent to become PADI Assistant Instructors. This course begins the PADI Instructor Development process and is scheduled during the first 4 days of our Instructor Development Course (IDC). The PADI Assistant Instructor rating authorizes you to function as an instructional assistant and independently conduct certain PADI programs. Successful completion of the AI course also qualifies you to participate in the Open Water Scuba Instructor (OWSI) program . Combining the AI course and the OWSI program into a continuous program makes up the entire IDC.

Our unique 4-day free IDC Pre-Study and Preparation Workshop is also available to our PADI Assistant Instructor candidates. Likewise our one month free Instructor Internship is available to graduates of our Assistant Instructor courses to help better prepare you for the OWSI program and IE. ## Emergency First Response Instructor (EFRI)

- **Minimum age:** None
- **Usual Duration:** 2 days
- **Course prerequisites:**
  - Have completed the Emergency First Response Primary Care (CPR) course within the past 24 months.
  - Have completed the Emergency First Response Secondary Care (First Aid) course within the past 24 months.
  - Have completed the Emergency First Response Care for Children course within the past 24 months.
  - Note: Practicing medical professionals (e.g. paramedics, EMT's, nurses, and doctors) are not required to have completed the Emergency First Response Primary Care (CPR), Secondary Care (First Aid) and Care for Children courses. Although participating in these provider level courses is beneficial, it isn't required since professional medical training serves as an equivalent.
  - We recommend that you complete both the EFR Primary/Secondary Care course and the Care for Children course as a prerequisite as the application to EFR Corp. is cheaper. Up until 1 July 2005 you can still complete the course if you have completed a qualifying first aid and CPR course and are Divemaster or above but you will need to make 2 separate Applications.
- **Medical requirements:** None
- **Cost:** US\$200
- **Course Description:** The 2005 Emergency First Response Instructor Course is an extended 2-day course. As an EFR Instructor you may provide interested individuals with the training necessary in EFR Primary Care (CPR), EFR Secondary Care (First Aid) and Care for Children courses (including optional recommended skills, AED and emergency oxygen.) This course builds on your skills as primary and secondary care providers and focuses on developing your instructional abilities. Through independent study, classroom sessions and practice teaching assignments you will learn to organize, conduct, market and promote the EFR programs. The class emphasizes hands-on skill practice and demonstrations and builds self-confidence.

## Emergency First Response Instructor Crossover program

- **Minimum age:** None
- **Usual Duration:** 1 day spread over 2 days
- **Course prerequisites:**
  - Hold a current CPR/first aid instructor rating with another qualifying organization.
  - Meet one of the following criteria:
  - Document current authorization to teach pediatric emergency care courses for another qualifying organization: or

- Have completed the Emergency First Response Care for Children course within the past 24 months; or
  - Complete Emergency First Response Instructor Course Presentation 5 (Care for Children Course Standards and Content) and 6 (Care for Children Skills Workshop) as part of the Crossover Program.
- **Medical requirements:** None
  - **Cost:** US\$100
  - **Course Description:** Individuals who are current CPR/first aid instructors with another qualifying organization may earn the Emergency First Response Instructor rating by completing an entire Emergency First Response Instructor Course or by attending an Instructor Crossover Program. If you were a renewed MFA Instructor up until 2001 you can still Crossover now. This course is normally conducted in conjunction with the 2-day EFR Instructor course.

### Emergency First Response Care for Children Instructor

- **Minimum age:** None
- **Usual Duration:** 1/2 day
- **Course prerequisites:**
  - Complete a training session with our Emergency First Response Instructor Trainer. This may be done separately or as part of an EFR Instructor course.
  - Complete an EFR - Care for Children course (layperson level) and submit a completed Care for Children Instructor Self-Study Knowledge review with the application.
  - Document certification as a current instructor with another regionally recognized organization and have authorization to teach a pediatric emergency care course. Also, submit a completed Care for Children Instructor Self-Study Knowledge review with the application.
- **Medical requirements:** None
- **Cost:** US\$40
- **Course Description:** The newly released, extremely popular, and necessary for anyone with children, working with children or around children is now available. The EFR Care for Children course teaches people how to provide emergency care for injured or ill children and infants. It is both easy and quick to complete as an add-on to the standard EFR Instructor course. This will be required for all EFR Instructors from 1 July 2005 and is included in our 2-day EFR Instructor course.

## Open Water Scuba Instructor (OWSI) program / Instructor Crossover

- **Minimum age:** 18
- **Usual Duration:** 5 days plus optional but highly recommended IDC Pre-Study and Preparation Workshop.
- **Course prerequisites:**
  - Prior to the start an individual must complete all (16) IDC Knowledge Reviews.
  - Be certified as a PADI Assistant Instructor or as a current instructor member in good standing with another recreational diver training organization for at least 6 months.
  - Be fit for diving and submit a Medical Statement for a diving medical examination conducted within the past 12 months. A licensed physician must sign the form and state that the candidate is fit for diving. The physician signing the form may not be the applicant.
  - Have been a certified diver for at least six months and have completed and logged at least 60 open water scuba dives (as documented in the individual's log book) and have documentation of experience in deep, night and navigation diving.
  - Submit proof of CPR and first aid training within the last 24 months.
  - Submit documentation of any qualifying certification for entry-level, advanced, rescue and leadership-level issued by another recreational diver training organization.
  - If not a PADI Divemaster, successfully complete the PADI Divemaster course diver rescue assessment.

The PADI Open Water Scuba Instructor (OWSI) program is run over 5 days designed to prepare qualified candidates to become PADI Instructors. This course is scheduled during the last 5 days of our Instructor Development Course (IDC). Either the OWSI program or the entire IDC must be completed before attending the PADI Instructor Examination (IE). Combining the Assistant Instructor (AI) course and the OWSI program in to a continuous program makes up the entire IDC. Scuba instructors certified by other organizations may crossover to PADI by successfully completing the OWSI program and the IE. You will need to arrive the day before to complete the Orientation though so it is a 5-½ day course.

Our unique 4-day free IDC Pre-Study and Preparation Workshop is also available to our PADI Open Water Scuba Instructor candidates. Likewise our one month free Instructor Internship is available to graduates of our Open Water Scuba Instructor program to help better prepare you for the IE and life as an Instructor.   - Be fit for diving and submit a Medical Statement for a diving medical examination conducted within the past 12 months. A licensed physician must sign the form and state that the candidate is fit for diving. The physician signing the form may not be the applicant.

The PADI Instructor Development Course (IDC) is a 9-day program designed to prepare qualified candidates to become PADI Instructors. The IDC is divided into two distinct segments. The first segment is the 4-day PADI Assistant Instructor (AI) course. The second portion is the 5-day PADI Open Water Scuba Instructor (OWSI) program. Together the two courses combine to encompass the entire IDC. Both courses must be completed before attending the PADI Instructor Examination (IE). Our IDC is actually run as four programs in one starting with the 4-day free IDC Pre-Study and Preparation Workshop, followed by the 4-day Assistant Instructor course, followed by the 2-day

Emergency First Response Instructor course and finally the Open Water Scuba Instructor program which precedes the PADI Instructor Examination.

Each segment can be scheduled as a stand-alone course or completed all at one time. ## **PADI Instructor Examination (IE)**

- **Minimum age:** 18
- **Usual Duration:** 2 to 2 1/2 days
- **Course prerequisites:**
  - Successfully complete an OWSI program or IDC within 12 months of the start date of the IDC.
  - Have documentation of at least 100 logged dives including experience in deep, night and navigation diving.
  - Present an Instructor Certificate of Completion that has both the OWSI/IDC completion date and dive experience sections signed by a PADI Course Director, OR present an IE Certificate of Participation indicating previous attendance at an IE and which modules need to be repeated.
  - Present an IE Enrollment form and appropriate IE fee.
  - Present a Medical Statement for a diving medical examination conducted within the past 12 months indicating that the candidate is fit for diving. The physician signing the form may not be the applicant.

- **Course Description:**

The PADI IE is scheduled immediately after six of our scheduled IDC's in 2005. The usual location is El Galleon Beach Resort, Small Lalaguna, Puerto Galera, Or. Mindoro. They usually use the same pool and open-water training site as we do so you are more at ease and familiar with the sites. The IE is a standardized, objective evaluation conducted by Instructor Examiners from PADI Asia Pacific or elsewhere. Therefore, it has no affiliation with iDAP, Asia Divers, or any other Instructor Development Center. Only PADI Asia Pacific or other Instructor Examiners are involved. Asia Divers will provide the necessary tanks and weights for your pool and open water examination sessions.

Instructor candidates must successfully complete the following exams and perform the following skills: 5-part Dive Theory Exam, PADI Systems, Standards and Procedures Exam, a Knowledge Development Prescriptive Teaching Presentation, Demonstration quality five skill circuit, a Confined Water Teaching Presentation, Rescue of an Unresponsive Diver at the Surface to demonstration quality using a pocket mask or mouth to mouth as prescribed, and an Open Water Teaching Presentation with two skills combined (skills can be from the Open Water Diver, Advanced Open Water Diver or Rescue Diver courses.)

  - Registration: Copies of the participants Scuba Instructor Certificate, CPR and First Aid qualification and DAN Oxygen Provider Certificate.
  - Evidence of the participants DAN membership or a completed DAN membership application form including payment for such.

## Master Scuba Diver Trainer Prep (MSDT)

Be a renewed PADI Assistant Instructors, PADI Instructor or have completed an IDC or Open Water Scuba Instructor (OWSI) program within the past 12 months. Certified PADI Assistant Instructors may participate in PADI Specialty Instructor Training courses prior to attending an OWSI program and PADI Instructor Examination (IE). After successfully completing training, PADI Assistant Instructors may apply for Specialty Instructor certifications in non-diving specialties, such as Equipment Specialist, as long as all other certification requirements are met.

Complete the PADI Enriched Air Diver course in conjunction with the PADI Enriched Air Specialty Instructor Training Course.

- **Completion Requirement:** Proof of 10 Logged Dives in each Specialty Rating Applied for.
- **Medical requirements:** Complete a Medical Statement
- **Cost:** US\$560 for 8 Specialties or US\$410 for 5 Specialties
- **Course Description:** The Master Scuba Diver Trainer Prep course is actually 8 Specialty Instructor courses conducted in an integrated manner over 5 days. The course is designed to train instructors how to organize, market, and conduct the following PADI Specialty Diver Courses:
